## Grand Reopening for Waterfront Redevelopers

### Déjà Vu All Over Again

On Monday, Nov. 17, RexCorp Glen Isle Partners hosted a grand reopening of its community informational office at 20 Glen Street. The office was filled to capacity with residents, city officials and representatives of the company

that will be developing the Glen Cove waterfront project. Taking center stage was an imposing scale model of the proposed development, replete with buildings, boats, trees and the Glen Cove Creek, from the gateway at the bridge on Glen Cove Avenue to the tip of the harbor. The walls were filled with posters and information regarding the site plan and the environmental aspects of the

development and monitors also displayed renderings and information. Guests mingled and asked questions of Mayor Ralph V. Suozzi and RexCorp Glen Isle employees, while enjoying refreshments provided by Page One Restaurant.

Since RexCorp has joined with Glen Isle, the project has been revisited, reworked and redesigned, and has also been approved by the Glen Cove IDA and CDA and is currently in front of the planning board.

A ribbon was cut and Mayor Suozzi remarked that it was a bit of "déjà vu all over again," while acknowledging that this time, the project is much closer to fruition. "This has been a long time coming," the mayor said, "and we have a renewed energy and dialogue with the developers." He called the project "good for Glen Cove, good for the surrounding areas and good for Nassau County," vowing to carry on the process as quickly as possible, with the continuation of due diligence. He thanked RexCorp Glen Isle for hosting the event and City Council members
